#### Advice to host fue poverty events chari

Citizens Advice Derbyshire
Districts is to hold drop-in
advice sessions on tackling
fuel poverty and rising energy costs at Co-op stores
in Ashbourne on Wednesday, January 23, and Ripley
on Friday, January 25, both

The events are timed to coincide with Big Energy Saving Week 2019, and come in response to an ongoing rise in the number of Citizens Advice clients being forced into crisis situations over a choice between keeping warm or going into debt. Spokesperson Russ Bosanko said: "Our energy work is becoming an increasingly significant part of our service. It is not just an important consumer' issue. "Rising costs of energy, a lack of access to affordable fuel, and barriers to keeping a home warm such as rural isolation and old, heat-inef-

ficient properties are having very real impacts on people's lives, well being and financial circumstances."

The charity is also highlighting the risk of loan sharks this month, who may prey on Amber Valley residents in financial difficulty after spending more than usual in December.

Campaigns officer Dawn Mackenzie said: "Christmas can take a heavy toll on people already struggling to make their money last and leave them with a debt burden. It can turn a difficult situation into real crisis."

"Loan sharks may appear friendly at first but interest rates can increase. We hear reports of people being intimidated or attacked, or ending up in a spiral of debt."
